## Minecraft is moving into the classroom

Popular computer game supports learning

MINECRAFT is coming to school. The education edi-tion of the popular compu-ter game will be rolled out in NSW classrooms.

Forestville Public was one of nine schools selected

to trial the pilot project.

Deputy principal Cathie
Howe said the multidisciplinary software would be linked to the school curricu-

"Minecraft Education Edition would be used for Edition would be used for specific projects to support learning and digital literacy," she said.
"Children won't be doing it all day, every day."
The school worked on age anymoriste, projects

age-appropriate projects. Kindergarten to year 6 have worked on different projects. One kindy class created their own virtual fairy tales. The process is a form

of transmedia story telling. Ms Howe said their teacher read traditional fairy tales which they turned into creative interactive stories.

With a story board template, students turned their stories into book form.
"They wrote one or two

sentences on a page and created a draft of the picture that added to the story," she said. "Next they drew and col-

oured in the picture."

With the help of their year 6 buddies, they typed their stories into the Book Creator App on iPads, took photos of their drawings and added them to their digital book in Book Creator, she said. Kindy and their buddies,

built their fairytale worlds

in Minecraft Education Edition so they could explore, interact and build up their fairy tales, she said.

The initiative focuses on problem solving, critical thinking and collaboration.

Other classes worked on science and geography concepts; while year 6 recreated Parliament House in Canberra as part of a unit on Government

Education Minister Rob Stokes said the Minecraft program would be expand-

ed to 10,000 students.

"We are not seeing kids locked in a room by themselves in front of a computer screen instead we are demystifying the use of technology," Mr Stokes said

The minister said technology could increase engag ment in literacy, numeracy, humanities and sciences


